## PA Activities 2023/24

- We undertook a survey of the parent body to find out what's important to you (see opposite)
- We partnered with the school to introduce a more transparent election process for parent's nominees to the Board of Management, resulting in a tenfold increase in the number of parents who voted in 2023 compared to the previous election.
- We participated in the school's Physical Activity Working Group, helped out with the Fun Day and ran an online physical activity webinar for parents.
- We provided input to school policies (e.g. anti-bullying and substance misuse)
- We are supporting the school's Well Read programme and negotiated a once-off 20% discount for students with O'Mahony's

**Parent Meetings:** We hold PA meetings 2 - 3 times per year, bringing parents and school management together for discussion and information-sharing
